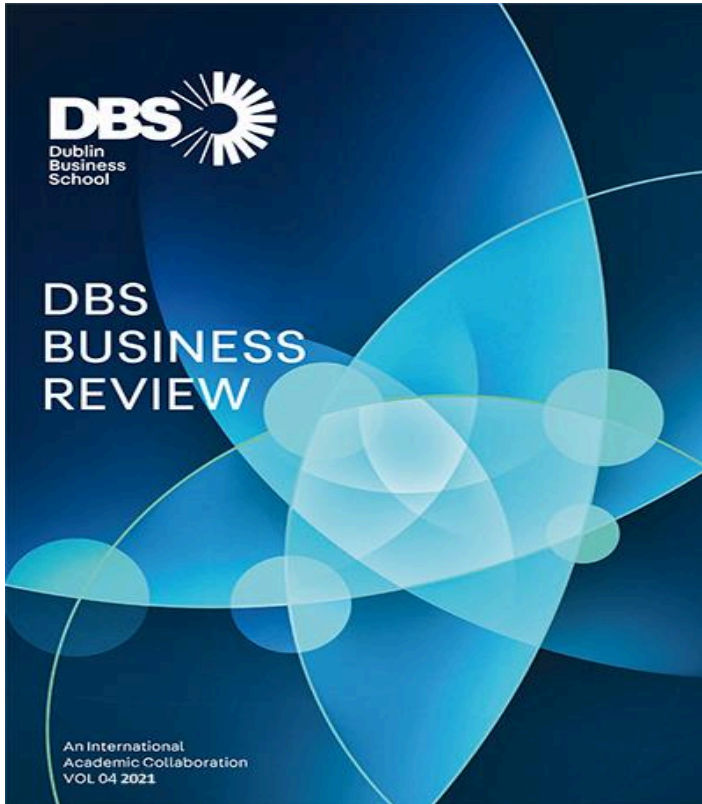

The Rationale for DBS Business Review

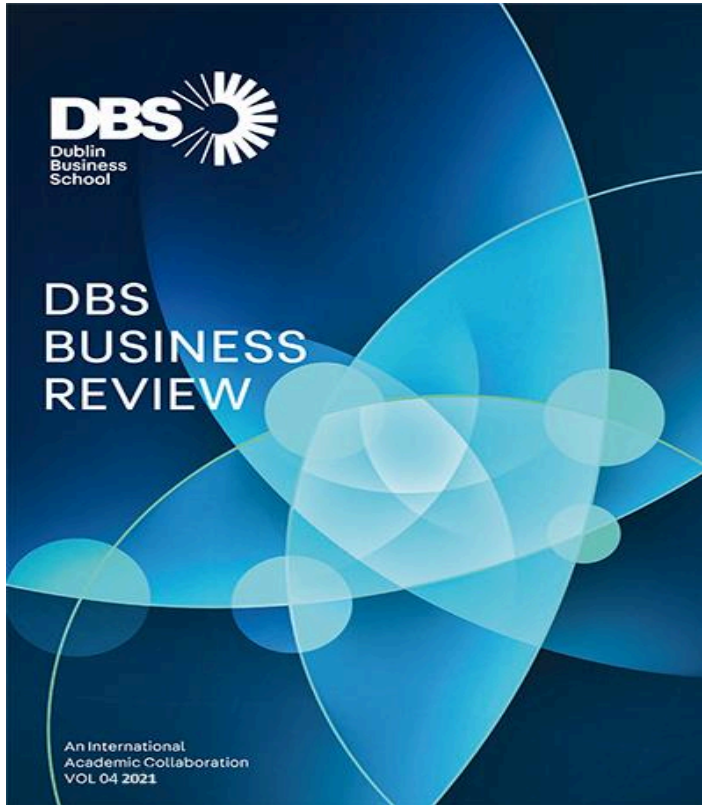
